Following a successful 37-year career in executive leadership within the Jewish community, culminating in 19 years as President & CEO of the Jewish Federation of St. Louis, and 14 years as an Adjunct Instructor, Barry Rosenberg joined the full-time faculty of the Brown School of Social Work at Washington University in St. Louis. As Professor of Practice, Rosenberg teaches and chairs the MSW Management Specialization. In addition, he leads the development of executive education and teaches intensive executive education programs. His consulting practice focuses on strategic planning, board governance and leadership development. He provides leadership and consultation on issues relating to the American Jewish community and global Jewish affairs.
